Be Courageous - we work hard and don't waste our own or others time.









#### Dear Parent/Carers

When you chose to send your child to English Martyrs' Catholic Primary School, you chose to send your child to a Catholic School. Just as in any other school, your child, whatever his or her background or abilities will have the fullest possible access to the National Curriculum and his or her personal, social emotional and physical needs will be catered for.

In our Catholic schools however, there is an added dimension – We are a Catholic school which seeks to live out the values of Jesus Christ. We promote these values by our words and deeds, and Catholic doctrine and practice therefore permeates every aspect of the school's activity.

The school is part of a wider Catholic community, that of English Martyrs' Catholic Church and the Parishioners. We support each other, working together for the good of the children and families in our care. Fr. Mariadass our Parish Priest has a pastoral role for our school.

From the beginning of your child's school career he or she will take part in simple liturgies at various points through the school year – either in school or in church.

We hope you will support our efforts to encourage your child to take part in both school and parish celebrations.

For baptised Catholic children, sacramental preparation is an important part of a child's religious development. Preparation takes place in partnership with parents and the parish. Parental support is vital to the child's experience of the Sacraments.





We provide a Catholic curriculum, which is broad and balanced, recognising that every pupil is unique and is created in the image of God. Our curriculum is designed to enable every pupil to discern their vocation and to be well-equipped to follow it as active citizens in service to the world.

Catholic Religious Education is the "core of the curriculum" and the foundation of the entire educational process. We also provide a wide range of extra-curricular activities and strong pastoral support. We incorporate democratic principles, value the rule of law, support individual liberty and foster a community in which different faiths and beliefs are respected.

We aim to work together with parents and the parish community to help your child develop and grow socially, morally, academically, physically, emotionally and spiritually, to become a well-rounded human being. So that he or she is secure and confident in his or her abilities and at the same time forms a personal relationship with God.

As we welcome your child into our Catholic school we also welcome you as a family and aim to develop an open and honest working relationship; encouraging our children to love themselves, each other and God and grow to be ambassadors of Christ's message of truth, justice, forgiveness and peace in their future lives.
